### **PASTOR BILL'S BOARD**



Tradition can be extremely helpful or rather unhealthy.

Take for instance the U.S. standard railroad gauge. The distance between rails in our country is four feet, eight-and-one-half inches.

Where did they come up with such an odd number? Because that's the way they built them in **England**, and American railroads were built by British expatriates.

Why did the English adopt that particular gauge? Because the people who built the pre-railroad wagons on the road in the old world used that gauge.

Why were wagons that size?? Because that size matched old wheel ruts on the roads.

Where did these wheel ruts come from?? The oldest and some of the most traveled roads in Europe were originally built by Imperial Rome for the benefit of their legions. Many of the roads become gouged with ruts first made by Roman war chariots. These chariots were this size because four feet, eight-and-one-half inches was the width a chariot needed to be to accommodate the rear ends of two war horses.

Twenty first century American rail road dimensions are founded upon the requirements of two horses' rear ends... because the Romans did it that way.


Sometimes we do things because... we just do them.

In the gospel of Mark Jesus is quoted saying to the Pharisees, "You have a fine way of setting aside the commands of God in order to observe your own traditions!" (Mark 7:9)

Again in Acts we see disciples scattering as far as Phoenicia and Cypress to proclaim Christ's message but only to Jews. God had called them to send His message to non-Jews as well – but not all followed those instructions. Because Jerusalem was mired in the mantra of we have always done it this way (we preach to Jews) these radical but obedient new believers ended up preaching to gentiles in far off Antioch. Their ability to change pleased God and eventually, the center of God's activity shifted from Jerusalem to Antioch. God's people were being called upon to do ministry a new way and He blessed them in it.

"That's the way it's always been" maybe true, and it **maybe** wise. But we need to ask ourselves is what is it that we **have been** doing and should **keep** doing it.

## Joy of Harvest (HMong Outreach) Ministries News By Sue Xiong

### **HMong Language School in Merced**

HMong Language School at St. Paul has been back in session, since February 4th. There are twenty-three students enrolled in HMong school this spring.

God is good and He has always been with us from the beginning. I can't believe it but it is true that HMong school has been here for two years now. We have shared and reached out to more than two hundred students with the Good News of Jesus Christ. As we continue this third year, we pray that the Seed will continue to be planted in many more students here in Merced.

### HMong Language School in Fresno

We are excited to announce that HMong Language School had expanded to Fresno and was successfully launched on February 4th. It is held every Saturday from 10 a.m. to 12 p.m. at Redeemer Lutheran Church. It will run through May 13th, as well as the one in Merced. The structure of the school is very similar to the one here at St. Paul.

The students rally up together for Bible lesson, devotion, and song before having HMong lesson. HMong Language School in Fresno is not only interested to children and youth but also to adults too. Therefore, we have thirty students enrolled Five of these students are adults.

As we were getting very close to launching the school, our helpers in Fresno backed out on us at the last minute. We had no choice but to proceed with it. After the first week of HMong school and lots of prayers, we are very thankful that God sent us one person to help Pastor Doua teach in Fresno. She is a parent of HMong school children and a Non-Christian. We also have two very helpful sisters and members of Redeemer Lutheran Church helping with snacks and activities.

I was very nervous when I first learned of the lack of helpers in Fresno. However, Pastor Doua reminded me with this verse from the tenth chapter

of Luke: "The harvest is plentiful, but the workers are few. Ask the Lord of the harvest, therefore, to send out workers into his harvest field". This then lead me further to Psalm 121:2. I know that my "help comes from the Lord, Maker of heaven and earth". Thank God for His comforting and promising Word.

Youth volleyball is scheduled to be begin again. It will be held on Friday nights starting March 3 from 6:30 p.m. to 9:30 p.m. Right now, we are scheduled to run through the end of May. All youth are welcome to come to volleyball night! We hope to see you there!



# Church Archives

BACK IN HISTORY..... by Theresa Lund, Historian

From February 2007 St. Paul Lutheran Messenger

In January, 1942, The St Paul congregation made application for membership in the Evangelical Lutheran Synod of Missouri, Ohio and Other States (Now LCMS).

March 24, 1942, the congregation resolved to request the District Mission Board to supply a resident pastor for Merced, and specified the Rev. Edwin Fritze as it's choice. He was called by the Mission Board. Rev. Fritze was ordained and installed on Cantate Sunday, May 3, 1942. Officiating was Rev. George C Jacobsen of Stockton. The sermon was preached by Rev. Arthur Brohm, Jr of Modesto. Others participating in the service were Rev. R Spannous, Rev. J F Bauermerate (spelling unclear) and Rev. H I von Renner as well as laymen Ray Menssen, Eldo Sprecher and E J Pohli (Spelling unclear).

The congregation purchased a parsonage, through FHA, at 51 Union Ave in the Pastor's name, in July.

Plans were drawn up for a church, but due to the war (WWII) and its restrictions, the idea was given up until more normal times. A building fund was established and invested in US Bonds.

Rev. Fritze left Merced in August 1943 to accept a teaching position at a Lutheran High School in Fort Wayne, Indiana. Rev. W B Struefert of Livingston served during the vacancy.
