# Notes From Vicar Doua

Dear Friends and Partners in Ministry:

My wife Sue and I thank God for your welcome and presence in ministry, since the day our family arrived in California one year ago. You are a blessing to us and we appreciate it very much.

According to the traditional way of seminary study, I must return to the seminary after a one-year of vicarage to complete my studies. However, I was asked to extend my vicarage assignment and carry on God's ministry here in the Central Valley to the Hmong and Southeast Asians through January of next year. The reason is that, as we all know by now, Pastor Kou Seying has accepted a call and moved away to be Dean and Associate Professor at the Concordia Seminary-St. Louis, MO.

The seminary has accelerated my studies, and I have been taking on-line classes along with my vicarage duties. In September, I will return to the seminary for ten weeks for more studies. Sue and the children will continue to stay in Merced. If things go accordingly, and God's will, I will be finished with my pastoral studies in mid January of 2016.

This is a very exciting and daunting moment for me and my family. Being in school full-time and doing ministry at the same time, especially taking over of what God has blessed Pastor Kou in ministry here can be overwhelming sometimes. However, I pray that the Holy Spirit will continue to grant us guidance and support in His ministry here in California. As I had a conversation with Mike Lange, CNH Mission Executive, I told him I was afraid of not being able to fill Pastor Kou's shoes. A very encouraging word from Mike, "Do not wear other's shoes. You will get blisters." This reminds me that each person is blessed differently by God. I cannot compare myself to others but to do only what I can with the ability God blesses me with. Therefore, I am willing and excited to carry this mission in Christ to the next chapter.

I look forward to continue partnership with you in ministry while I service the Lord here in Central California. I personally ask that you please keep me and my family in your prayers. Thank you!

Together we are building the Kingdom of God with the help of the Holy Spirit.

Again, I thank the Lord for all of you.
