Dear Friends and Members of St. Paul's,

First of all, I want to take this opportunity to thank those of you who have participated in the cottage meetings during the month of August. Your opinions matter to your Transition Team for it helps the team prepare future plans and goals for St. Paul and prepare the profile of the pastor who will best lead you to accomplish that plan.

Let me share a tentative agenda for the months ahead. September will be used by the transition team to tabulate the results of your surveys, examine demographical material for Merced, consider the availability of resources (both human and material) and brainstorming about the future of this congregation and school. We will also evaluate present ministries and determine whether other ministries should be considered to take their place.

My hope is that we can take the results to the congregation so they may confirm the findings of the Transition Team or revise them. At that time, the congregation will be prepared to vote on a call committee. The Transition Team will then become advisory to the call committee. The congregation will then be issued a call list from the CNH district. I believe that the call committee can be in place sometime in the month of October.

This is a cursory overview of the future months here at St. Paul. Please keep your transition team in your prayers as they enter into some super busy weeks.





1980

Singles were meeting regularly in various homes and on Feb 17, held a topic discussion on Budgeting and the Proper Use of Finances.

The Choir from Good Shepherd Lutheran Home of the West sang on February 24 at St. Paul.

In the spring a committee for the resettlement of a Laotian family was busy organizing efforts and setting goals. Coordinator was Carolyn Clayton.

A Frog Kissing Celebration (VBS) was held summer evenings for the whole family.

Fellowship Club sponsored a trip to Oakhurst to attend an old fashioned melodrama at the Golden Chain Theater on Friday, August 29. Amid peanuts, popcorn and beverages, the folks booed and hissed the villain all evening, and of course they clapped for the hero.

A new roof was installed on the church and parish hall at a cost of \$6000.

Roy Blumhorst was guest preacher at an afternoon Reformation Celebration Service on October 26. A mass choir sang and light refreshments were served following the afternoon service.

On December 14, Gary & Jean Olthoff, missionaries with Lutheran Bible Translators, shared insights into their work in Liberia, West Africa. Toshiko Knaack served as guest organist to enhance the worship experience.

Over the years the Lutheran Women's Missionary League has held many Mission Safari Nights. The idea originated in 1953 when Mrs. William (Lynn) Petzold suggested a progressive dinner with each "mission station" serving a part of the dinner and the ladies giving a program about work in the country they had chosen. The home was decorated in the theme, the committee dressed in costume and the food served representative of the "mission station". The LWML carried out the program for several consecutive years then discontinued it. In October 1971 the Mission Safari was once again a special night.
