Dear Christian Friends,

German pastor Martin Rinkart served in the walled town of Eilenburg during the horrors of the Thirty Years War of 1618-1648. Eilenburg became an overcrowded refuge for the surrounding area. The fugitives suffered from epidemic and famine. At the beginning of 1637, the year of the Great Pestilence, there were four ministers in Eilenburg. But one abandoned his post for healthier areas and could not be persuaded to return. Pastor Rinkhart officiated at the funerals of the other two.


As the only pastor left, he often conducted services for as many as 40 to 50 persons a day-some 4,480 in all. In May of that year, his own wife died. By the end of the year, the refugees had to be buried in trenches without services.

Yet, while living in a world dominated by death, Rinkart wrote this timeless prayer of thanksgiving for his children:

Now thank we all our God, With hearts and hands and voices; Who wondrous things hath done, In whom this world rejoices. Who, from our mother's arms, Hath led us on our way, With countless gifts of love, And still is ours today.


It is my belief that Martin Rinkart began where we all need to begin as God's people regarding gratefulness. Gratefulness can truly begin when we recognize our condition as we stand before the cross of Jesus Christ and remember that the Son of God gave up His life for us because as broken as we are and as sinful as we are, Jesus still loved us more than we could ever imagine or understand. Another of our hymns states: "Nothing in our hands we bring, simply to His cross we cling." The only direction from that place is "gratefulness." Martin Luther said that we are mere beggars before the cross of Christ. Some beggars never get it. Here is the truth from God's Word: "that while we were yet sinners, Jesus died for us." That is where gratefulness begins. A blessed Thanksgiving to all of you!

Fellowship, December 10, 1953: Members of the newly organized social club of St Paul Lutheran Church selected as its name "Adult Friendship Club". Membership is open to any individual or couple wishing to join in fellowship and fun. Meetings are held in the evening on the first Sunday of the month. Merwin T Greer was president and Mrs. Robert Klein served as Secretary. Following the singing of Christmas carols, games were conducted and refreshments served by the hosts Mr. and Mrs. John Lubbock and Mr. and Mrs. William Petzolds. Others present were Rev and Mrs. E A Wessel, Mrs. Antonia Greer, the Harold Zimmers, William Sharpes, Hubert Noacks, Dwight Pearsons, Leland Miracles and Carl Luebkemanns. Accepted as new members that evening were Mr. and Mrs. Russell Bryson, Mr. and Mrs. William Chapman, and Loran Dockter.

Fellowship Club

FEBRUARY, 1954: The training and work of a deaconess in the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod, was shown in colored slides at the missionary league meeting of the Women's Guild. Many of the scenes were taken at Valparaiso University in Indiana. A flip chart showing the structure and work of the Lutheran Women's Missionary League was displayed. The Brownie troop sponsored by the Guild invited members to a tea March 9, 2:30PM in the Parish Hall.

APRIL, 1954: Women from St Paul Lutheran Church attended the eleventh annual convention of the LWML, California-Nevada District at Zion Lutheran Church in Terra Bella, California. Convention goers witnessed the ground breaking for the Good Shepherd Home of the West for handicapped children. Rev E A Wessel and his son Edward took part in the ceremony. Delegates voted to give financial aid to three mission stations during the coming year at South San Francisco, Sebastopol and Henderson, Nevada.

EASTER SUNRISE SERVICE: St Paul Lutheran Church sponsored an Easter Sunrise service at the Starlight Drive In Theater. Hwy 99 South at Gerard Avenue. The service began at 5:30AM, Come as You are, stay in your car! The Rev E A Wessell spoke on the subject "I Know That My Redeemer Lives". The church choir sang "The Strife is Over";" Palestrina" and "Jesus Christ is Risen Today".
