Dear Friends,


About 35 years ago, I became friends with a man who was around my age. His name was Russ and he had served in Viet Nam and had been exposed to heavy amounts of Agent Orange, a herbicide meant to defoliate the areas in Viet Nam where guerilla troops were hiding and being recruited by the U.S.'s enemy. Russ served Calvary Lutheran Church in a number of ways when I became their pastor in the early 80's. He and I became friends because shortly after I arrived in Oroville, he was diagnosed with cancer which was a result of his exposure to Agent Orange. He was a strong and courageous young man who had a wife and two sons who he loved very much. He worked at a lumber mill and worked as many days as he could to support his family.

He suffered with cancer for a number of years which required me to travel back and forth to Enloe Hospital in Chico to visit him and pray with him. Sometimes I would get calls in the middle of the night telling me that Russ was probably not going to make it prompting me to drag myself from a sound sleep to drive to Chico to be with him and his family. Somehow, the Lord allowed him to bounce back again and again and again until early one morning when his family and I gathered around him and he finally breathed his last breath and was taken home by his Lord.

Russ's oldest son was, at the time about 10 years old, went running from the room at a break neck speed and didn't return for some time. His mother knew him well and told us to let him go. She assured us that he would be back. She was right. About an hour later, he came back and hugged his mom. It was obvious that he had been crying and that he was exhausted. Later, I spoke to her and she said he had been running for the entire time he was gone. He didn't know where he was going. He was just running and running and running.


Death and the pain it brings often makes us want to run as far away from it as we can. There is a reason for that. It is incompatible with our design. We were not designed to die. When sin was introduced by Adam and Eve in the garden many years ago, it brought with it the death penalty. Romans 6:23: "The wages of sin is death..." God grieved that day and He grieves every day when one of His creatures meets the enemy of death. God never intended for His children to know death. But when Satan, through sin, captured humankind's attention with words like: "You will be like God," they were lured to eat the forbidden fruit and transgress God's command to them. Their transgression brought consequences from a just and holy God. The consequence was eternal death.

If that is the end of the story, then there is good reason to run. Run and don't stop running. If nothing else, maybe it will keep me young and healthy. But don't stop running because death is in hot pursuit of each of us and it will catch us sooner or later.

But thanks and praise to God, that is not the end of the story. Romans 6:23 says: "The wages of sin is death, but the free gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord." God's steadfast love is in hot pursuit of us as well. Like a shepherd in pursuit of a lost sheep, a widow searching for a lost coin or a father scanning the horizon for a rebellious son, God will not give up in his search for His children and He sends His only Son to assume our flesh and become one of us living among us in our sin and brokenness. He sent His only Son to become our Savior who died for us, taking our sin with Him into death. His Son will pioneer the way for us as He is raised from the tomb on Easter morning and allows us, by faith in Him as our Redeemer, to lift our eyes above the horizon of this world to get a glimpse of the world where He now resides and into which He welcomes all who have believed in Him and followed Him. And that is the end of the story. It is a story with a happy ending.

Come join us as we celebrate our wonderful God and Savior for He is risen! He is risen indeed! Hallelujah!

HMong School is scheduled to run from March 5th thru June 4th 2016. This is the fourth term in school session for us. Currently we are expecting around thirty to forty students this spring. What exciting news!

### LUTHERAN CHURCH GROUND BREAKING IS SCHEDULED (SUN STAR)

St Paul's Lutheran Church will hold a ground-breaking service for its new parish hall on the site at 23<sup>rd</sup> and P Streets, Sunday following the regular morning service. Construction of the building is expected to begin next week with E M Geyer, general contactor, in charge. The present church site, a plot 150 feet by 150 feet, was acquired three years ago, and immediately the congregation started the preliminary work for a building to take care of its needs. A building committee consisting of Harry Heil, Perry Isbell, John Lebsock, Ray Menssen, Harold Zimmer, Sr and the Rev George Hoffmann, pastor of the congregation was appointed. Walter R Hagedohm, AlA, church architect of Los Angeles was engaged to draw up sketches and then the complete plans and specifications which were completed about a year ago. The parish hall is to be the first unit of the church plant, the church itself to be a project for the future. The dimensions will be 82 feet by 58 feet. The building will include an auditorium seating more than 200, stage, pastor's study, class rooms and kitchen. Construction will be of basalite. Although the structure is designed as a parish hall, it will also be used for all worship services until the congregation can realize its hopes for a sanctuary. After the service Sunday morning at the Women's Clubhouse at 22<sup>nd</sup> and N Streets, the congregation will go to the church site for the ground-breaking ceremonies, which will begin about 12:15pm.

SUN STAR AUGUST 3, 1949: The St Paul's Lutheran Ladies Aid met Wednesday evening at Merced Women's Clubhouse. Mrs. Harold Zimmer, president, opened the meeting with prayer. Plans were made for the dedication of the new Parish Hall. Refreshments were served by Mrs. Marjorie McDougall and Mrs. Ruth Jueneman.




