Having served as a pastor in four churches for almost 40 years at the time of my retirement, I have a sense of what pastors look for in a calling congregation as they pray and deliberate a call to a congregation. Most pastors will look at the spiritual health of the congregation in regard to their stewardship. Please don't quickly jump to the "money" issue when I mention stewardship. You see, to be a good steward means to be a "healthy" follower of Jesus Christ and that requires us to assess this multi-faceted subject far beyond our financial health. By the way, the Bible mentions possessions and finances hundreds of times. Apparently, the subject must be important for our life.


Another area a pastor will examine when considering whether a congregation is serious about their mission, is willing involvement of the lay people in the work of ministry. The Bible teaches in the letters to the Corinthians and Romans that God blesses each believer with gifts and abilities so that they may use them for God's kingdom work. Part of the responsibility of the pastor is to help individuals discern what their gifts may be and how they can be used for the work of the church.

Another area which a pastor often examines is the spiritual health of the people of the congregation. Are the people hungry for the Word? Sometimes that can be determined by how many folks are in regular Bible Study.

If a pastor is considering a call to a congregation, these are some of the areas affected by the stewardship of the congregation which he may likely be praying and thinking about. So, I will be addressing the topic of stewardship in the days ahead.

Finally, on a somewhat unrelated matter, I will be holding two or three open forums with a completely open agenda. The purpose of the forums are to simply let me hear your feedback and evaluation of interim work accomplished thus far and perhaps yet to be done, along with any other questions you may have of me about anything at all on your minds. Plan now to attend an open forum on Sunday, April 24 at 3:00 p.m. or Wednesday, May 4 at 7:00 p.m. If needed, another one will be scheduled.

Back in History By Theresa Lund, Historian

In August 1968, Keith Lund, delegate from St. Paul attended the International Youth Gathering at Perdue University. 160 youth from the California Nevada District made a bus pilgrimage (actually four buses) to La Fayette, Indiana. In route the delegation visited Lutheran campus facilities and scenic points of interest. Four thousand youths attended business sessions, Bible studies, encounters with world problems and fellowship under the theme "Gathering With Joy". A giant birthday party was held to celebrate the 75th anniversary of the youth group known as Walther League. This assembly dissolved the Walther League forming an organization known as Lutheran Youth Fellowship. This subsequently resulted in the creation of SPY (St Paul Youth) in Merced.

Confirmation was held March 30, 1969; Paula Alexander, Angie DePriest, Nona Mills, Hans Schmiedl, Kathy Steinhoff, Kent Christensen, Lori Fulton, Bobby Lund, Jeannette Sigl and Chris Weed became members of St. Paul.
