#### Patience Please

Many years ago, before direct-deposit, a man stood in bank line in the San Fernando Valley of Los Angeles with me and a whole host of other folks. I had calculated my arrival at the bank to happen a little before the lunch hour rush, and yet the line was still quite long. A few minutes after I got in line the window clerk put up a closed sign on her window and apparently went to lunch which required another clerk to come in and set up costing us more time in line. The elderly man in front of me quipped, "This is my first Social Security check, I hope I can get it cashed before I die."

Well, he did....get it cashed before he died. I saw it with my own eyes. However, not before I considered that perhaps death was an option to standing in that slow-paced line. Paul writes in Galatians 5:22-24: "But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, PATIENCE, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, self-control; against such things there is no law. And those who belong to Christ Jesus have crucified the flesh with its passions and desires."

I commend the people of St. Paul for being so patient throughout this calling process. And while the process isn't complete yet, your patience and willingness to hold in check the anxiety that drives impatience is encouraging. Please continue to allow the Holy Spirit the room to work this patience in you.


How many of you parents out there can relate to this proverb about patience? "The more you ask how much longer it will take, the longer the journey seems." The call committee has been working diligently behind the scene to move this process along. There are many things which they have had to wait on people to provide lists and set appointments perhaps causing the anxiety level of many of us to increase and impatience to kick in.

The calling process can go in many directions as some of you are aware. Some pursuits end up in blind alleys....some at dead-ends, some at detours, and some find unexpected doors to be opened requiring a reevaluation. In all of it, the Lord is still in control, in spite of how it looks to us. What we do know is that "patience" is a needed fruit of the Spirit during this time in the congregation's life. One reason for patience is reflected in a proverb written by a man named Robert Green back around the days of Martin Luther. "Hasty climbers have sudden falls."

St. Augustine once said that "patience is the companion of wisdom."


The choosing of a pastor must not be a hasty process. The consequences can be disastrous. Rather this process needs to be accompanied by wisdom and patience. Paul writes in Galatians 5:25: "If we live by the Spirit, let us keep in step with the Spirit." This is good advice for an important time such as this.

#### **Devotion by Pastor Doua**

<sup>35</sup> Jesus went through all the towns and villages, teaching in their synagogues, proclaiming the good news of the kingdom and healing every disease and sickness. <sup>36</sup> When he saw the crowds, he had compassion on them, because they were harassed and helpless, like sheep without a shepherd. <sup>37</sup> Then he said to his disciples, "The harvest is plentiful but the workers are few." (Matt. 9:35-37)

### Evangelism/Ministry Updates

Jesus' ministry through Joy of Harvest continues. In August, a group of HMong in Fresno contacted Joy of Harvest to help them start a HMong worship at another church location in Fresno. We have a HMong worship at Peace Lutheran, Fresno. On September 17th, Joy of Harvest went to fellowship with them for the first time. Pastor Doua opened the night with a devotion from Luke 9, "The Wise and the Foolish Builders." This passage made most of us realize that in order to have a strong congregation, both the leaders and members need to build their foundation on the Rock (Christ) but not on the sand. Following the fellowship, a few came up to us saying, "Please help us, we are lost and hungry for God's word in our HMong Language."

As you can tell, the drought in California is severe, but God continues to water all that has planted. The only problem as in Matthew 9, "The harvest is plentiful but the workers are few." So please keep Joy of Harvest HMong Outreach Ministries in your prayer that through this ministry God will raise trustworthy and Godly leaders who can speak the HMong language to lead these lost and hungry souls.

Moreover, Joy of Harvest is excited about launching a ministry at the University of California-Merced. St. Paul Lutheran Church, where Joy of Harvest is based at, is only two miles away from the university. We have been praying for two years now and thought of reaching out to the college students. Finally, we are meeting with the president, vice president, and board members of the HMong Student Association at UC-Merced next month. If all goes well according to God's will, UC-Merced will be another ministry chapter for Joy of Harvest.

While HMong school is going on, Pastor Doua is leading a Bible study class for the parents. Many of the parents are not Christians but some are willing to stay for Bible study.

#### **BACK IN HISTORY**

A Mission Festival was held October 25, 1970. The evening began with a 4 p.m. Vesper Service. The parish hall and classrooms were decorated to show world wide mission work in the LCMS. The displays were assembled by Sunday School Classes, Bible Classes and various organizations of the congregation. After a potluck supper, Rev. Rudolph Frieling showed movies of Alaska and spoke on the work that he was involved in there.

In November, William Petzold, Stewardship Chairman, conducted a series of cottage meetings on Sunday afternoon and evenings. Seventeen homes hosted the informal meetings where the general idea of Stewardship was discussed under the theme "Commitment". On November 29, t here was a special act of dedication at both the 8:30 and 11 a.m. services. Members dedicated their time, talents and treasures to the Lord's service.

St. Paul Youth presented a Christmas Worship Service on Wednesday evening. The upper grades part participated in "Peace For The Uproar". The service combined Biblical tradition with contemporary audio-visual techniques. It told the Gospel for today and showed that Christmas is more than a nostalgic event.

On January, 1971, burglars climbed the roof of the church and broke a window and jumped down 12 feet to the church floor. They took a set of ball point pens valued at \$2.00.

Confirmation was held April 25: Young people who confirmed their baptismal vows were: Lynn DePriest, Doug Dick, Dwayne Dick, Ronda Dorrell, Rhonda Fulton, Gerald Herrington Jr., Chris Kleinhans, Brenda Mennsen, Karen Moen, Kenneth Niemeier, and George Pirtle.

Bert Berthelsen was a delegate from California-Nevada-Hawaii Dist. And attended the Synodical Convention in Milwaukee, Wisconsin, July 9-16, 1971.
